Developmental Service Worker Diploma International Student Program Admission Requirements

1. International Student Application form
2. International Fee of \$500.00 CAD (non-refundable) payable to GRACE LANCETA, College Director-CRD College of Health Care - can be send via Western Union
3. University/College Diploma & Transcript of Records or Comparative Evaluation of Credentials evaluated by World Education Services check with <https://www.wes.org/ca/> for more information
4. Applicable for applicants if English is not the first language. English Proficiency requirements are as follows for consideration:
 - o A minimum TOEFL score of 550 (paper based) or 80 (internet based with no test below 20) - TOEFL code 9212, OR
 - o Academic IELTS with an overall minimum score of 6.0 (with no single test score below 5.5)
5. CAAT level D for Mature Student, can be taken prior to enrollment
6. Copy of Passport
7. Proof of Criminal Record Check
8. Proof of Medical Clearance Check (can be submitted after student visa obtained)
9. Health Insurance Coverage once arrived in Canada (pls. see lists of Canadian insurance brokers)
10. Before or upon arrival in Canada student need to pay 20% of the cost of Developmental Service Worker Program or \$2,000.00 CAD and remaining balance can be paid according to agreed payment schedule.

Guidelines for Admission

Step I. Submit the following required documents to CRD College of Health Care

1. Email CRD College at info@crdcollege.com of your intention to apply for the Developmental Service Worker Program.
2. Complete ISP Application Form on line at www.crdcollege.com under ISP page
3. E-mail ISP application form along with the following documents:
 - Photocopy of Educational documents such as College or University diploma, transcript of records & comparative evaluation from World Education Services
 - Proof of English Proficiency if applicable e.g. EISLT or TOEFL
 - Copy of Passport
 - Copy of Criminal Record Check or Police Clearance
 - Make a payment of International Fee \$500.00 CAD via Western Union payable to Mary Grace Porrás Lanceta, RN College Director CRD College of Health Care (pls. note this fee is non - refundable)
4. Advise CRD College via e-mail at info@crdcollege.com of payment details.
5. Once CRD College received payment and required documents and student has been accepted by the College based on its admission requirements then a letter of acceptance from the school will be mailed and a scanned copy of the letter of acceptance will also be e-mailed to the applicant.
6. Student then apply for a student visa with Citizenship Immigration Canada. For information how to apply a student visa visit <http://www.cic.gc.ca/english/information/applications/student.asp> or you may get professional assistance from a licensed Canadian Immigration Consultant. Pls. note CRD College of Health Care cannot guarantee entry visa to Canada, student applicants still need to comply with Immigration Canada visa requirements.
7. Make arrangement for accommodation in Canada. School can provide lists of potential rooms or apartment/condominium rentals around the area.

8. Obtain a student health/medical insurance coverage... must be purchased within Canada... this can be purchased prior to your arrival. School can provide lists of Canadian Insurance Brokers for student's assistance.

Step II. Upon Arrival in Canada

1. Arrange to take an admission test with CRD College.
2. CRD College will then start with the enrollment process. College and student will then sign an enrollment contract. Student need to pay 80% of the overall cost of school fee.
3. Attend student orientation day prior to starting the program

Step III. Preparing for Developmental Service Worker Practical Training

1. Obtain a medical clearance certificate from a Canadian Medical Doctor.
2. Obtain a police vulnerability check from the Canadian City/Region where the student is residing.
3. First Aid & CPR certification will be scheduled by CRD College prior to community training.
4. Provide Copy of Student Medical Insurance Coverage... need to submit prior to enrollment

Developmental Service Worker Program

Approved as a vocational program under the Private Career Colleges Act, 2005

In this program student will learn the different stages of human development, developmental disabilities, available community, social and economic support services that help clients with developmental disabilities. Students will have understanding of different behavioural/intervention strategies, differentiate normal and abnormal psychology, practice effective communication techniques and develop skills on interpersonal relationship and proper counselling. Skills Competency will be developed in the class room lab, counselling labs as well as the opportunity to have the practical experience managing and assisting clients who have behavioural, physical and cognitive disabilities through various community placements specific to those clients with special needs.

What is a Developmental Service Worker? (DSW)

A Developmental Service Worker is someone who is trained for employment in a number of human health sectors that specifically deals with developmentally challenged individuals. DSWs have theoretical and skills training on how to manage the physical, psychological, emotional and behavioural care of those children and adults who have developmental challenges. Graduates are in demand to work in community developmental services centres, group homes, or opportunity to manage own behavioural clinics that deals specifically for clients with developmental challenges like down syndrome, autism, cerebral palsy, learning disabilities etc.

Program Description

The Developmental Service Worker is a 1 year Full-Time Program which is a total of 1345 hours in length program including 825 hours in-school theory, 175 hours school lab, and 345 hours of on-the-job training (Field Practicum) in selected community care agencies, behavioural clinics & group homes that specializes with clients who have developmental disabilities. The Field training allows students to apply the skills and knowledge gained during the in-class training. **Graduates** will obtain **Developmental Service Worker Diploma** upon completion of all necessary requirements for graduation.

The Developmental Service Worker as a Career

As per Statistic Canada there are over 62,000 adults and 28,000 children have developmental disabilities. These population requires the help of Developmental Service Worker leading to a wide range of work opportunities such as:

- Community Program Counsellor
- Residential Counsellor
- School Educational Assistant
- Day Care Classroom Assistant
- Community Support Worker
- Behavioural Therapy Assistant
